# **Budget Results for July 2023**

\$502,732.26 Total Budget Money Available July 1, 2023
+ 32,625.95 Money Received in July
<u>- 24,202.15</u> Money Spent in July
\$511,156.06 Money Available July 31, 2023

For the month of July, 2023, the Church Budget received \$8,423.80 more than it spent. For the year, the Church Budget received \$56,412.47 more than it spent.

<u>Major Maintenance & Repair Fund</u> – this designated money will be used to pay for major maintenance or repair projects to the Church building, parsonage or parking lot. The Board of Trustees must recommend all expenditures from this fund to the Church Council, and the Church Council must approve all expenditures from this fund. This is a perpetual fund and a minimum balance of \$2,500.00 shall be maintained at all times. \$74,626.71 MM&RF Money Available July 31, 2023

**Other Designated Gifts** – occurs when the Church receives money for a designated purpose and the Church shall only spend this money for the purpose that it was given.

# \$101,800.00 Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund

In order to plan and provide the necessary funds for the care and upkeep of our cemetery, a Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was created. This fund was a non-expendable trust fund in which the principal (donations) cannot be spent but the interest earned on the principal can be spent for the care and upkeep of the cemetery. The Perpetual Care Cemetery Fund was capped as of July 17, 2016 by the Church Council and is no longer taking donations.

## \$57,085.58 Helen Grady Endowment Fund

The money was donated to our church from the estate of Helen Grady in 2007 to be used for improvements to the church, community, or the development of an individual. The money is at the United Methodist Foundation of WNC, Inc. and the amount that can be spent annually is 5% of the last three (3) years average end-of-year balance.

### A Christ-Centered Grief Recovery Support Group

### Begins Tues., Sept. 12<sup>th</sup>, 2-4PM (Classroom TBA)

Have you recently lost a spouse, child, family member, or friend? You have probably found there are not many people who understand the deep hurt you feel. This can be a confusing time when you feel isolated and have questions about things you have never faced before. I, and many others, understand and would like to reach out to offer support through GriefShare.

### What is GriefShare?

GriefShare is a thirteen-week program, focused on helping individuals learn how to understand their grief and move forward again. GriefShare groups meet weekly to help you face these challenges and move toward rebuilding your life. Each GriefShare session has three distinct elements:

### Video Seminar with Experts:

Each week your GriefShare group will watch a video seminar featuring top experts on grief and recovery subjects. These videos are produced in an interestingto-watch television magazine format featuring expert interviews, real-life case studies, dramatic reenactments, and on-location video.

The video can be viewed at the group site, or online.

## Support Group Discussion with Focus:

After viewing the video, you and the other group members will spend time as a support group, discussing what was presented in that week's video seminar and what is going on in your lives.

### Workbook-based Personal Study and Reflection:

During the week you will have the opportunity to use your workbook for further personal study of the grieving process and to help sort out your emotions through journaling. Your group will spend time discussing questions and comments from the workbook study. Participants are welcome to join the group at any time. If you miss a session, you will be able to "make it up" during the next 13-week cycle. For more information on GriefShare, contact Pastor Joseph at (336) 674-0155. # RECYCLE FOAM:

### An Easy Way to Help Keep God's World Beautiful

Throwing your styrofoam containers and packaging in the garbarge? STOP! That does get rid of it for YOU but it fills up the dump sooo much sooner than needs to happen and that will end up being a greater expense to taxpayers in the end.

Alternative: **Recycle the foam.** Let it do some good. Bring it to church (BUMC) and drop it off in the box labeled *"Styrofoam"* in the conference room. Lois Bazhaw will collect it and take it to a recycling center in Greensboro. At the recycling center, the foam will go through a desification process that produces ingots that are in used in a variety of useful products, such as picture frames and moldings.


